On a National level, fewer members means less sway with Congress and fewer funds generated to assist Veterans. Closer to home, if our Department membership becomes too small, we won't be able to maintain our office and staff in Lincoln! Imagine trying to operate our posts without their assistance! I don't know about you, but I know I have a question or need assistance from them on a weekly basis. I count on John Liebsack, Trudie Hammers and Jody Sullivan for a lot. They are all always working in the background to keep the lights on and the wheels turning!

We are now in the last 1/3 of the membership year and are down over a 1000 members! We need your help to reverse the trend – it has been over 8 years since we made 100%. I go out and "beat the bushes" several times a week. Can you make time to do so once or twice a month of a weekday evening or Saturday? Have you contacted your unpaid members? Have you asked Department for a list of unpaid members on the Members at Large, Relocated, or other nearby posts? Have you held a recruiting event? Are you visible in your community?

We must all fight for membership. If you are not recruiting enough additional members to replace your deceased, your post will wither and cease to exist. My post has been around since 1932. I would absolutely hate to see it die! Are the same comrades always filling the officer positions? Are you/they tired of being the post Commander/Chaplain/etc... every year? It isn't going to change unless you recruit! So get out there and help National, Department, and your post – recruit!



Larry Gerlt will be the Senior Vice Commander for 2016-2017 year and the Department Membership Chairman. Larry has developed a great plan for membership. All District and Posts must be aboard for this to be effective. You will be hearing more about his plan in the future.

The Department will be monitoring membership and programs of the Post in the Department. If a Post is not doing anything with membership and programs and other responsibilities, the Department may look at closing the Post or consolidating them. It is long past time that Posts remember why they are a VFW Post.

I urge everyone who can attend the State Convention in Kearney in June from the 9th to the 12th.
