On New VFW Members....

Happy New Year! Welcome to 2015 – the membership year is already halfway over. Speaking of membership, what do you do when a new member or reinstated member joins your Post? Do you send him/her a welcome letter/email? If new to the VFW and/or your Post, do you tell them anything about the history of your post: what year it was started, a few facts about who it was named for, who the post officers are and how to contact them. Do you encourage them to attend meetings? If they can't/don't/won't attend meetings, do you explain to them the importance of their membership - 95% of our membership does NOT attend meetings or assist the post and/or post home. But, we cannot effectively lobby congress without them! When they do come to a meeting do you make them feel welcome? Do you introduce them to those present? If they have something to say or a question (yeah, some of their questions may sound kind of dumb to us "old timers"), do you honestly listen to them? Do you give a polite, heartfelt response? Or do you dismiss their ideas with a: That won't work. We tried that 15 years ago. Etc!

A decade ago, we had 1.9 million members/ auxiliary members. Now we have about 1.6! While recruiting is a issue, retention is an even larger issue. As a CNR, I can tell you that when I visit with past members, the biggest complaints I hear are: No one ever contacted me, so I didn't bother to renew. I wanted to help do things, but no one ever asked me to. I tried to get the membership to work on the programs, but all they wanted to do was drink at the bar. I suggested we..., but was told that won't work and it was dismissed out of hand.

Do you want your post to grow or die out and fade away? Do you want to the VFW to grow or die out and fade away? It's a new year. Let's all make a resolution to recruit new and past members and make them feel important – whether they come to meeting or not, to keep in contact with them, if only by email. We all say we're the greatest organization in the world. Let's go out and prove it!




The winners are...

Jr. Vice Commander-in-Chief Brian J. Duffy will represent the national organization at Midwinter



Brian J. Duffy was elected as Junior Vice Commander-in-Chief of the Veterans of Foreign Wars on July 23, 2014, at the VFW's 115th National Convention, held in St. Louis, Mo.

Mr. Duffy served in the U.S. Air Force as a Jet Engine Mechanic on F-4 "Phantom" fighter aircraft, and later transitioned and served as a Flight Engineer on the C-141 "Starlifter" transport aircraft.

He deployed in support of several campaigns, to include Grenada, Panama and Desert Shield/Storm, and among his numerous military decorations are the Air Medal, an Air Force Commendation Medal, the Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal, the Southwest Asia Service Medal and Kuwait Liberation Medal. Upon returning from Grenada in 1983, he joined VFW Post 6590 in Cookstown, NJ, but later transferred his membership to VFW Post 1170 in Middletown, KY., in 1989.


Following his military service, he was employed by several airlines as a Flight Engineer Instructor before joining United Parcel Service Airlines, where he rose through the ranks and would retire as Assistant Chief Pilot of UPS, after flying worldwide as an Instructor/Check Captain on the Boeing 757 and Boeing 767 aircraft.

When not in the cockpit, he enjoys playing competitive ice hockey and serving fellow veterans and military through numerous volunteer programs with the VFW, Honor Flight, and recovering warrior projects.

In 2006, Mr. Duffy was elected Commander of the VFW Department of Kentucky, and has achieved All-American status at Post, District and State levels. His Honor Flight activities have been recognized throughout the Louisville community, to include the Kentucky Derby Festival and the Kentucky Aviation Hall of Fame. In 2012, he was the recipient of President Obama's Volunteer Service Award, after being nominated by UPS to recognize his volunteer activities.

Mr. Duffy is a VFW Gold Legacy Life Member, as well as a member of the VFW National Home for Children, the Military Order of the Cooties, the American Legion and AMVETS. He and his wife, Jean, who serves as the VFW Post 1170 Ladies Auxiliary President, reside in Louisville, and have two adult children; Tara and Andrew.
