Governor Pete Ricketts announced a legislative initiative to transfer the administration of Nebraska veterans homes to the Department of Veterans Affairs on January 9th. VFW State Commander Doug Whitaker commended the action which will move jurisdiction from the Nebraska Department of Health and Human Services. The move will focus more attention on veteran services while reducing state taxpayer costs. About 550 veterans live in the 4 homes.


Post 2704 in Omaha Honors Comrade

VFW Post 9675 in Papillion hosted Cub Scout Pack 60 in October. The event included a flag raising, it took place at the post home.









VFW Post 9675 Has Poppy Drive

Kevin Jones Assigned to Mid Winter Conference






