There are three parts of maintaining post membership: retention, regaining lost members (reinstates) and recruiting new members. If you want to retain current members, you must:


- 1. Have an active post that works the programs. People feel good about themselves when they help other people and/or see them rewarded for their efforts. VOD, PP, Teacher of the Year, Scout of the Year. Do you seek entries? Do you provide meaningful recognition to your winners?
- 2. Recognize your volunteers for their efforts.
- 3. Minimize/resolve member conflicts.
- 4. Contact your annual members other than to request their dues. Post news letter, calling team, or an occasional visit by a post member.

Regaining lost members (Reinstates). Do you obtain a list of past post members to contact? Have you asked Department for a list of Relocates (members from other states who live in your area) and Department at Large (unpaid Nebraska VFW members who do not belong to a specific post)?

Recruiting new members. Do you conduct at least one new member drive each year? Set up a recruiting booth at a local fair/rodeo/auto show/etc. Host a meal or coffee and desert at your post home or local café.

Two thing to remember: You can't renew your way to 100%. Recruiting is a team effort; no one person can make a post, district and our Department 100%. We need each post and each active member helping achieve this goal. You've heard it before, but I'll say it again, if each active member recruited just one new or reinstated member we could achieve 100%!




