





- 2) Any individual or organization wishing to support the National Home's mission can become an Associate Life Member. Associate Life Members do not have voting privileges.




VFW NATIONAL HOME FOR CHILDREN

Dear VFW Comrades,

There are over 144,000 veterans in Nebraska, over 14,000 are military retirees, over 14,000 are disabled veterans. It is gratifying that many veterans contribute much to their communities by involvement in non-profit community organizations which assist its citizens. It is, however, deeply concerning that so few of us are actively involved in the democratic process in Nebraska. That includes being knowledgeable about what our leadership is doing to ensure Nebraska's economy is viable for decades to come.

The Nebraska Veterans Coalition has since early 2014 been working with Nebraska Legislators, the Governor's Office, other Nebraska Executive Offices, along with the Nebraska and Omaha Chambers of Commerce, to persuade all concerned to use veterans and military retirees as part of a concerted first step to improve the numbers of highly skilled leaders and workers in Nebraska's work force.

We believe that Nebraska must make more efforts to expand its skilled labor population to attract more businesses to Nebraska. It does not make good sense to not make needed efforts to retain veterans and military retirees as a logical first step to increasing the work force. It is a complex issue on how best to increase Nebraska's population. It involves reform of taxation, use of educational systems, marketing of Nebraska, developing long term plans and investments to achieve goals, to name just a few...

Why do retirees flee Nebraska? According to the Platte Institute the main reason is taxation.. In 2014, 3,500 Nebraskans moved to Iowa. Why? Because Iowa has done much more for retirees and for veterans and more effectively understands the value of retaining higher income people and veterans. It is not enough to increase veterans benefits to compete with other states. Nebraska must market itself to people to increase its workforce. Nebraska has not had an effective program to market itself nationwide to attract new citizens to Nebraska nor does it have a coordinated plan or effort to retain its veteran population. Your help is vitally needed.

What can you as one citizen do about this? Become involved. All it takes is to know who your state senator is, contact them and ask for their views on economic development and what they are doing to make a difference.


