Quarterly Community Service Reports

As part of Commander Yount's All-State program, Posts are required to submit a Community Service report **QUARTERLY**. Please report your community service that Post/Auxiliary members complete as the service is done. It is important that these reports are received so that your Post is recognized for their work and the work insures the continued non-profit status of your Post.

IRS 990 Processing

As Posts, you must ensure that a 990-N is filed and you have record of that submission. During Post Inspections or sooner, if possible, the Department must receive your request to file the Post's 990-N on your behalf. The Department may file your 990-N, so long as the Post's income does not exceed \$50,000. If your income exceeds this threshold, an accountant or tax preparer must file for the Post.

Department has become aware of letters being mailed to Posts regarding previous years in which there is no record of the 990 filing. If you are a Post that has received one of these letters, please contact the Department to rectify this filing issue.



We trace our roots back to 1899 when veterans of the Spanish-American War (1898) and the Philippine Insurrection (1899-1902) founded local organizations to secure rights and benefits for their service. Many arrived home wounded or sick. There was no medical care or veterans' pension for them, and they were left to care for themselves. In their misery, some of these veterans banded together and formed organizations that would eventually band together and become known as the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States.
