### NATIONAL PRESIDENT DEE GUILLORY TO VISIT NEBRASKA

Dee Guillory of Gloucester, VA, was elected National President of the VFW Auxiliary in July 2017.

Dee joined the Auxiliary of her grandfather on her 16th birthday. She has served the organization in many capacities, including Auxiliary, District and Department President.

After serving 34 years as a civil servant in the Department of Defense, Dee retired in July 2013 from the Pentagon where she worked for the Chief of Naval Operations in the Office of Operations, Strategy and Policy.

### MEMBERSHIP & LEADERSHIP

As I sit here and write this article on 12/8/17 our membership stands at 85.68%. That's not bad, but we could be better. We still have 1 Auxiliary that has not transmitted any memberships at all this year and a couple that have only transmitted 1 or 2 members. I don't understand why. We are halfway through our membership year, and almost at the end of the year. All the members that are not paid by January 1 will no longer be a member in good standing. They will not be allowed to attend the meeting in January. That will hurt your Auxiliary because it may cause you not to have enough members for a quorum. In that case you cannot conduct any business.

Enough of the preaching. We had 2 Auxiliaries reach 100% by the goal 2 deadline; they are 8332 Arlington and 6159 Taylor. Congratulations. We have 7 Auxiliaries that are 100% or better, 7970 Harrison, 5287 Neligh, 5545 Randolph, 6928 Pender, 8332 Arlington, 6159 Taylor, and 5136 Lexington. The next goal deadline is January 31 for Auxiliaries with memberships of 101 to 200 members. Most of you in that group are getting close and 1 has already made it. We have 31 Auxiliaries that need 5 or less members to be 100%, I am hoping that they make it by the end of the year.

Try setting a table at a Post or Auxiliary function to collect dues from members that come to functions. You can also try putting together a membership committee to call members to remind them that their dues are due. Membership is all our jobs, not just the treasurer. Please call on President Carol, Chief of Staff Dixie, any of the Line Officers, or me if you need help collecting dues, or if you need some new ideas. All of us are more than glad to help. I know that the holidays take us away from doing the work of collecting memberships, but the holidays are over now so let's get back "On Course for Our Veterans."

## AMERICANISM

Happy 2018! We have heard reviews of the past year on the news, let's review the Auxiliary programs you have done the past 6 months. Did your Auxiliary present flags, make a visit to schools, use the media, hand out POW/MIA information, plan a Family Freedom Festival, etc.? During your review, make notes or fill out a report form and send to me. To the Auxiliaries who have sent reports, thank you for your promotion of patriotism in your community.

As I speak of reviews, let us review some of the Auxiliary traditions. At a local Auxiliary meeting, after entering the room, the doors are closed and all members must show current dues card.

Raps of the gavel by the President mean:

**One rap = Attention; two raps = Rise; three raps = be seated.**

**"Attention"** means hands at side, head up with eyes looking straight forward.

**"Parade rest"** means left foot is moved slightly to side while bringing arms to small of back. Clasp left thumb in right hand. The head is bowed slightly during prayer.

During our ritualistic meeting, the President says **"Salute"** when flags enter and leave the room as well as when we say the Pledge of Allegiance and sing the national anthem. Salute the flag by placing the right hand flat over the heart.

I have presented a little review of our Auxiliary traditions, now your Patriotic Instructor can help members understand the rest of our Auxiliary tradition. Members need to show the proper respect to the flag, proper respect for the Altar and Bible, in addressing the President, and making a motion.

Fly the flag every day or on the following special days:

January 1 – New Year's Day

January 15 – Martin Luther King, Jr. Day

## GOLD STAR AND CHAPLAIN

HAPPY NEW YEAR EVERYONE! May the light that shined on you during the Christmas season continue to light your way throughout the year. Be the light for our veterans and their families by continuing to support the Auxillary programs.

I read a commentary in the Omaha World Herald in November that was written by Don Bacon who represents Congressional District 2 in the U.S. House. There is not enough room to share all of the article, but I do want to pass along what Don is doing for our Gold Star Families.

On October 2, 2017, Senator Bacon introduced H.R. 3897, the Gold Star Family Support and Installation Act of 2017. H.R. 3897 is about a commitment to ensure lifetime access to military installations for Gold Star spouses and children so they can attend memorial services and visit gravesites. It will also provide ease of access to other benefits, one of which is grief counseling to which they are already entitled.

H.R.3897 addresses this issue in statute and requires standardization and reciprocity across all military services. If a surviving family relocates and the nearest installation is from a different branch of service, the family would be able to access the installation.

The bill would also allow surviving spouses who remarry to keep commissary, exchange, and other base facilities benefits for as long as dependent children of the deceased service member still live at home and are entitled to use them.

On October 7<sup>th</sup> the bill was referred to the House Committee on Armed Services and passed the committee without objection. On October 8<sup>th</sup>, the bill was received in Senate, read twice, and referred to the Committee on Armed Services.

Gold Star families confront many challenges, often made worse by policies that fail to compassionately honor the memory of their loved one's service and ultimate sacrifice to the nation.

I am asking each of you to contact your senators and representatives to show support of this important issue. STAY ON COURSE FOR OUR VETERANS!

## A Note or Two from your Department Secretary



**Official Ruling on Life Member Transfers**

December 13, 2013 then National President Armitha "Sissy" Borel issued an Official Ruling, which reads, "A Life Member Transfer does not have to provide proof of eligibility to accompany her Annual or Life Member Change Form and duplicate accepted application." Various questions have been raised regarding the Ruling, and the matter has been reviewed by the National Line Officers and Advisory Committee.

After completing the review, the National Line Officers and Advisory Committee recommends the Ruling be declared null and void, as it does not comply with the Bylaws. The review considered that all members of the VFW Auxiliary have equal rights, and every member should be held to the same requirements. Bylaws Section 106B (formerly Section 113A under which the 2013 Official Ruling was made), Life Membership Transfer, provides, "A member may be accepted as an Auxiliary Life Member Transfer in the same manner prescribed for an Auxiliary member transfer." Bylaws Section 106A, Annual Transfer, provides, in part,

- Any member in good standing may transfer to any Auxiliary or to or from Member At Large
  - o Upon presentation of a completed and executed application. (See page 1 Booklet of Instruction)
  - o Upon acceptance by the Auxiliary of their choice.
  - o Upon presentation of their current membership card


Then, it should follow that a Life Member Transfer would also present a completed and executed application (with proof of eligibility).

Based upon my review, I believe the National Line Officers and Advisory Committee reached the correct conclusion. Therefore, I hereby order that the Official Ruling of December 13, 2013 on Life Member Transfers null and void. National Bylaws Sections 106A and 106B shall be adhered to as currently written, and the Treasurer's Guide shall be updated according to this Ruling.
