


On May 28, 1936, Congress passed Public Law 630, granting a congressional charter of incorporation to the VFW in order to protect the VFW's name and Cross of Malta logo. This charter was signed by Franklin D. Roosevelt.

 Audie Murphy, **America's most** highly decorated WWII soldier, was inducted into Dallas VFW Post 1837 in 1945.

 In November 1904 the first issue of Foreign Service was printed. This was the predecessor to the VFW Magazine.

 In 1995, the first all-women VFW Post was inaugurated in Topeka, Kansas.




❖Did you know?

❖Did you know?


 VFW had an instrumental role in forming the Senate Veterans Affairs Committee in Washington, D.C.


 1955 was the last time the Commander-in-Chief was elected directly by delegates.

❖Did you know?


In 1984, VFW membership passes 2 million mark.
