What are its objectives?

1. To coordinate a state-wide intelligent, aggressive and serviceable organization for the purpose of promoting all activities found to be for the benefit of all veterans and their dependents and/or survivors of the State of Nebraska.
2. To provide a practical means by which veterans organizations throughout the state may effectively contribute to the betterment of all veterans and their dependents and/or survivors as follows:
 - a. State legislation affecting veterans and dependents and/or survivors.
 - b. Concern for the general programs for veterans and all veterans organizations represented, including medical care, employment and social activities.
 - c. To establish a system of public relations to inform the public on behalf of all veterans and veterans organizations.

How goals are achieved?

The Nebraska Veterans Council meets quarterly at the VFW Headquarters Office in Lincoln, Nebraska to discuss concerns of its member organizations throughout the state.

The Council sponsors the Veterans Legislative Day event at the State Capitol every year. The Governor and several State Senators who have introduced legislation are invited to speak to the group of veterans assembled in Warner Chambers.

Council members testify at hearings in the State Capitol in support of, or opposition to, newly introduced legislation.
