challenge Is On



Honoring Fallen Comrade

Several VFW members were on hand on November 3rd at the Delta airlines air cargo terminal. This is the first of many honor guard ceremonies being performed by VFW members. Members come to the terminal whenever a body is being sent to the forensics lab at Offutt Air Force Base. The unidentified remains are those of World War II veterans who were buried in a German cemetery which is closing.
