
UNK Homecoming Parade


Post Gets Help With Poppy Distribution

Hello.

Last year we introduced LB279 in an attempt to exempt Veteran Organizations and Clubs from having to pay sales tax on their food and beverage sales. We wanted to do this because we think this money would be better spent in the community and to lower the burden on the good work that your clubs provide. The problem, was that last year the fiscal note for our bill to remove this sales tax was incredibly high, and frankly, too high for it to pass which kept it in committee. The way that we can lower this fiscal note is to get information from the VFW, American Legion, and DAV regarding how much they are paying in food sales tax each year, and show that it would not be as high as the fiscal note claims it would be.

What would be great is if you could collect is how much money your post made in food and beverage sales last year, and how much you had to pay in sales tax from that. If it wouldn't be too much trouble, it'd even be great if we could get maybe the last three years information, but if nothing else, last years would be very helpful.
