Korean War Veterans Honored

A ceremony hosted by Governor Pete Ricketts to honor Nebraska veterans that served in the Korean War was held on July 27th. Ambassador for Peace medals were handed out at the event held at the Capital Rotunda and a proclamation was signed. Over 300 people were in attendance as he praised the bravery of those who fought. Governor Pete Ricketts was joined by Dongham Yang, deputy consulate general of the Republic of Korea in Chicago and John Hilgert, Nebraska Veterans Affairs Director. July 27th is National Korean War Veterans Armistice Day in America, which marks the signing of the Korean Armistice Agreement. This year is the 65th anniversary of the signing of the proclamation. The agreement halted fighting but no peace treaty ever was signed. Neither side officially won the war and the two countries remain divided.

All annual members will now expire at the end of the month that they are signed up. This is a new change out of National so it is supposed to make it easier to track when annual members expire.








James Mueller to Represent National for Homecoming and Fall Council



Commander-in-Chief 2005-2006 Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States

James R. Mueller was elected Commander-in-Chief of the Veterans of Foreign Wars on August 25, 2005, at the 106th national convention held in Salt Lake City. He is only the second member from Missouri to be elected to this position.

Jim served in the U. S. Army from 1966-68. As a senior truck driver with the 446th Transportation Company, 57th Transportation Battalion, Jim's unit played a key role in delivering essential supplies to combat ground and air units during the 1968 Tet offensive as well as assisting U.S. Special Forces evacuate Montagnard tribesman from the area around Khe Sanh. He earned the Vietnam Campaign Medal, Vietnam Service Medal and the National Defense Service Medal.

Mueller joined the VFW in 1970 at Post 5077 in O'Fallon, Mo. where he maintains his Life Membership. He has served in various positions at the Post level including Post Quartermaster and in 1987-88 he achieved All-State Post Commander. In 1992-93 he earned All-American Department Commander honors. Jim has served on various national committees including Voice of Democracy, Homeless Veterans, National Security & Foreign Affairs, POW/MIA and Buddy Poppy. He served a two-year term as a VFW national council member in 1997-1999 representing members from Missouri and Indiana. In 1999 Jim served as the national convention chairman when the VFW celebrated their 100th anniversary in Kansas City, Mo.

Over the years, he has been active in his community and his church. In 2000 he was named O'Fallon's volunteer of the year. In 1994 Mueller was presented an award for his outstanding loyalty and support of the O'Fallon Fire Protection District. He is a member of the Knights of Columbus, Amvets, American Legion and Military Order of the Cootie.

Mueller is retired from General Motors Parts Division where he was employed for 34 years.

Jim and his wife Patricia have been married more than 40 years and have two children. They reside in O'Fallon, Mo.
